



Mark Slavik

Mark Slavik was born in Saigon, Vietnam in 1967. At age nine, he was adopted by Andrew and Mary Slavik and finished high school in upstate New York.

Mark graduated from the State University of New York Maritime College in 1990 with a Bachelor of Science in Computer. He also obtained a 3rd Mate's unlimited tonnage license in the U.S. Merchant Marine and a Navy Reserve Commission. He has since completed his Masters of Arts in Organizational Management from the University of Phoenix. Mark retired from the US Navy as a Lt. Commander in 2014 after 24 years of service.

Mark's Navy career began at New York Maritime as a deckhand on the training tugboat, General Phillip Schuyler. In 1991, he was ordered to San Diego during Desert Storm to start his Surface Warfare training. He also completed a Gas Turbine Engineering Certification and attended Naval Legal Officer School. Mark reported to his ship, USS PRINCETON (CG-59) in the spring of 1992. He served as the Repair and Electrical Division Officer, and the engineering department's training officer.

Mark's Navy experience has equipped him well for his new role as a USFHP Field Marketing Representative. That experience includes a stint as a Canvasser Recruiter at the Naval & Marine Corps Reserve Center, Long Beach, CA. He was responsible for the recruitment of qualified individuals into the Naval Reserve commissioned programs. During his tenure at N&MCRC Long Beach, Mark was recognized as NAVRESCUITCOM DET ONE Reserve Officer Recruiter of the Year. In addition, he was the national Minority Officer Recruiter of the Year.

Mark also served as the Officer Programs Officer to NAVRESCUITCOM AREA WEST and the Enlisted Programs Officer. While there, he managed over 200 enlisted recruiters and 15 officer recruiters in a fifteen state territory.

In 2005, Mark was transferred to Navy Recruiting District Seattle as a Human Resource Officer/Division Officer/ Navy Reserve Officer Recruiter. He lead four recruiting stations with over 12 recruiting personnel in and around the Puget Sound. He was recognized four times as the Reserve Officer Recruiter of the Year and the Division Officer of the Year. Mark resides in Covington WA with his wife, Hanh, and their five children.
